It gives me pleasure to recommend Ms. Morgan LeBlanc. An antique house itself offers certain challenges – sump pumps, alarm systems, generators when we lose power, private water supply, etc. We came home to green plants, sorted mail, a clean house, food in the fridge, her sheets and towels laundered and the bed remade with clean linens, and a detailed journal of important events during her stay. Oh, and in her spare time she bathed the dogs – a welcome surprise.

I'm fairly hard to please, and upon losing our house sitter of 15 years spent a great deal of time recruiting and interviewing would-be successors. I am totally pleased with Morgan and delighted that we can depend upon her in the months and years ahead.
